Mathematics

Welcome to 5th Grade Mathematics! We are excited to learn many new skills in math class. The 5th grade math program builds on many 4th grade skills, so any time spent learning or reviewing these concepts will be very beneficial.

Websites for fun learning and reinforcement of math skills:

www.aplusmath.com Go under “Flashcards” or “Games” on the left side of the screen. They can practice adding, subtracting and multiplying. It is very important to know the addition, subtraction and multiplication facts from memorization or within a couple seconds.

www.mathisfun.com Select numbers then Math Trainer for adding, subtracting and multiplication. Or at the home screen select games and pick a game to play.

www.aaamath.com At the top pick “Fourth” or “Fifth” for a challenge. Choose any of the activities like multiplication then select “play” option toward the top of the screen. 20 Questions and Countdown games are good ones.

www.funbrain.com Lots of fun games to choose from.

Other games and activities you can play:

Take a deck of cards and remove the face cards (kings, queens, jacks). Aces are one. Divide the cards evenly among 2 players. Each player flips over a card. The first one to add the 2 numbers correctly the fastest wins the cards. After going through the pile of cards, the player with the most cards wins. You can do a multiplication version also.

Mathematics

REVIEW: Grade 4

Operations and Algebraic Thinking 4.OA

- Use the four operations with whole numbers to solve problems.
- Gain familiarity with factors and multiples.

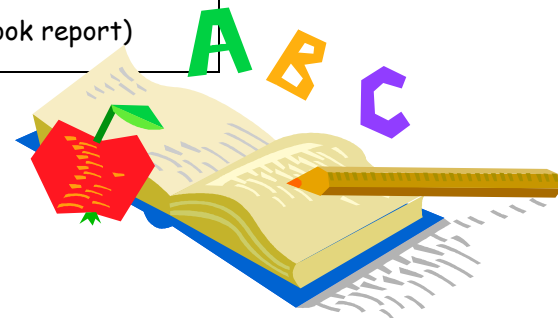


Dear Parents,

In an effort to keep our students reading this summer we have established a set of guidelines. In order to fulfill the summer reading requirements please refer to the criteria listed below. Children entering second through fourth grade have the choice to complete a book report or an Accelerated Reader type quiz, called Book Adventure, for each required book. Incoming fifth graders must complete the Book Adventure quiz and a book report for each required book. Please refer to the enclosed suggested list of books for your child to select from.

Attached is the book report format as well as the directions for registering and completing a quiz with Book Adventure. On the first day of school, your child must bring either their book reports or the quiz printouts from Book Adventure (grades 2-4) or both (grade 5). Thank you for your assistance with this program. Incoming 5 th	3 chapter books (must complete <u>both</u> quiz <u>and</u> book report)

After you finish reading a book, click Quiz-o-matic. Enter the title of the book you have just read. A quiz for that book will appear. Answer the questions and click submit. Once you have clicked enter, your score will automatically appear and you will see how many points you have earned.

Click on Win Prize to view how many points you have earned. You can also trade them in for prizes. Click to view prizes available and points needed for each prize. Pick one or two you would like to earn and post the number necessary near the computer or in your bedroom to help you remember to keep reading!!!

This is a very easy site to navigate. You can easily manage your account. It will automatically keep track of the books you have read and the points you have earned. Save them and earn a big prize.

Reports allow you as a registered parent to view and monitor your children's Book Adventure progress. The first chart on the page lists all Readers who are connected to your account. This report lists children by their User Name, along with their cumulative score, available points, total books read, last book quizzed, score on last quiz, and date of last quiz. Clicking on a child's name generates the individual status report, which shows each book that your child has read and been quizzed on, the date each quiz was taken, and the highest score on each book quizzed.
