Identifying A Meaningful Project

To be meaningful, a community service project must address a real need or problem found within the school or community. Students are given the opportunity to select a community service project that reflects the needs of the community and the student's personal interests and skills. In addition, quality community service projects require an on-going commitment on the part of the student. Hastily planned, short-term projects do little to foster the purpose of community service - to provide service to the community and personal growth opportunities for students.

Students may choose one major project to complete from year to year or may combine multiple projects. If students select to combine multiple projects they should combine them in one Project Proposal and One Project Summary Report. The following criteria should be considered when a student selects a community service project:

- The project addresses a real community need or problem.
- The project provides the student with the opportunity to provide meaningful and vital community service.
- The project allows a student to gain a greater understanding of the community need or problem on which they are working.
- The project reflects the student's interests, talents, and abilities.
- The project provides the student with the opportunity to grow personally.
- The project provides the opportunity for continuity of service and/or participation over a significant portion of the student's school experience.

Directions:

1. The top of your essay must have your full name, grade level, and project title.
2. Complete all parts of the required essay as outlined below. Remember to summarize multiple projects in one essay.
3. Staple the essay to your Acknowledgement Letter. (It is **strongly suggested** that a **duplicate copy be made of the essay and acknowledgement letter.**)
***NJHS and NHS members must make copies - one to turn in for school and one to the club advisor. ***
4. Submit a hard copy of your log and the attached essay for final approval and signature to your Social Studies Teacher or Ms. Gutierrez

Required Essay: Summarize your community service experience(s) in essay form. Address each of the following in your essay. The essay should be at least 2 pages in length.

1. Briefly describe your project(s) and the main activities of your project(s). Describe changes you made from your original proposal.
2. Briefly outline the steps you took to plan, implement, and complete the project(s). Indicate how much time you spent in completing all aspects of this project(s).
3. Describe the problems that occurred, if any, during the project(s). Explain how these problems were resolved.
4. Describe the impact you believe your project(s) had on the community or on the people who received your service.
5. Describe what you learned about your community as you worked on your project(s). Describe what you learned about yourself and the importance of giving something back to others.

Or

This is your opportunity to write a farewell essay to your school or talk about the challenges of having attended school in the current unprecedented times. This essay might include: memorable experience(s) that impacted you while attending the Sagemont school. Stories about teacher(s) that inspired, a social justice topic that you learned about during your senior year.
